



Hosting the Billy Frank Jr. Statue maquette

Display requirements

- **Placement:** Host sites *should* place the maquette in an area that is easily accessible to the public. The host site *must* lock the building when staff are not present.
- **Pedestal:** Host sites *must* place the maquette on a sturdy pedestal. To place the figure's face at visitor eye level, we recommend a pedestal height of at least 2 feet, ideally 3 feet. Contact us if the host site does not have a pedestal.
- **Interpretative signage:** Host sites *must* place interpretative signage near the maquette. We can supply a variety of interpretative signage options, including:
 - Free-standing vertical banner with brief information and a QR code
 - A series of mounted 24"x36" display boards with information about the subject, the artist, the legislation, and the artistic process
- **Supplemental materials:** Host sites *must* provide a place for supplemental materials near either the maquette or the site's entrance/exit. These materials comprise:
 - Informational brochure (required)
 - Informational cards (required)
 - Timeline handout (optional)
 - Stickers (optional)
 - Youth activity sheet (optional)
